2021 Council Honorees Individual Contributions

Throughout 2022 we will feature each of our distinguished award recipients and their individual contributions.

Meet Douglas E. Wright Meritorious Service Star Honoree:

Douglas Wright would definitely be considered a long time, committed and dedicated Scouter ... and when you get to know him a little bit more, you will understand why Scouting has always been a part of his DNA! Douglas' contributions to Scouting encompass a wide range of areas and equate to over 30 years of service to an organization he truly loves! Today he serves as the Advancement Chair and a Committee Member of Troop 2 in the Lost Dutchman District.

During his service to Scouting, Douglas was a Scoutmaster for 6 years and during that time, he mentored over 30 Scouts to achieve Eagle Rank. Part of that process included organizing 18 Eagle Court of Honor ceremonies. When the LDS church left Scouting, Douglas continued working with Troop 2 from Gilbert. Having received three mentor pins shows the impact he has had on the lives of these youth. Douglas is a friend to all and lives up to the Scout motto. He gives 100+% to everything he does.

Douglas participated with the Baden Powell University Faculty as the "Storyteller", playing the role of Lord Baden Powel. Using his "funky stick with the seeds inside", he would share wonderful stories about Scouting, demonstrating his passion for Scout service and the mission of the movement. Woodbadge trained in 2010 and following up as a Troop Guide in 2013-14, Douglas continued to learn and share his knowledge and expertise in

an array of Scouting activities and events which include; hosting the Arizona State Fair BSA Exhibit, Heard Pueblo Cub Scout Day Camp; Cub Scout Olympix Chair; BALOO, OWLS and Cubmaster Trainer; and a Webelos Den Leader. During this time, he earned the Boy Scout Leader Hall of Fame in 2011, the Scouter Key in 2012 and the District Award of Merit 2019.

Douglas is totally vested by demonstrating "Boots on the Ground" in how to lead his Cub Pack, Scouts BSA Troop and Venture Crew. Quoting a fellow leader, "Young men at all levels have learned from his skills, observed his example, have given service to others, achieved awards for personal advancement and earned funds to support BSA activities. Anyone who is willing to go to camp five years in a row, investing his time and resources understands that Douglas Wright has earned the privilege of being recognized for his efforts."

For example, he hosted the flag fundraiser project to raise funds for Scout Camp R-C and Geronimo, and dedicating hundreds of hours to planning and facilitating Scouting activities at our Council camps, in addition to leading 10 scouts on a 65 mile 2 week hike through Philmont park in 2010. Throughout these experiences, Douglas continues to lead by example. He is a friend to all, making sure to include everyone and that nobody gets left behind.

Outside of Scouting, Douglas has served as the United Food Bank food coordinator, Arizona Junior Achievement mentor/ presenter 1987-88, United Blood Bank & United Way Chair and participant, Rotary Club member and Parks and Recreation volunteer:

"As my father, I witnessed Douglas stay up many a late night making sure everything was prepared and ready to go for Scouting activities. At the same time, he balanced his work and home life being a wonderful father and husband. My father made time for anybody who needed help and led with a tremendous example. Growing up my dad did not have the privilege to be a part of a Boy Scout troop. However, he made sure to give that opportunity to as many leaders as possible. He makes me proud to be his son and an Eagle Scout.," says his son, Jacob Wright.

Without a doubt, Douglas Wright has share so much of himself in Scouting, given so much dedication and commitment to the youth and leaders, and has truly impacted the lives of so many over the years. We celebrate an incredible volunteer who heartily deserves to be honored with the Meritorious Service Star. 

New Scoutbook Supports New Eagle Applications

Scoutbook now supports Eagle applications for both the 2016 and 2022 versions of the Eagle rank. The application version will automatically be selected based on the version of Eagle set on the Eagle rank page for the Scout. Application versions can be distinguished as follows:

- 2016 Eagle application does not have the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge in required portion of the Merit Badge table and has a version date on page 2 of February 2022.
- 2022 Eagle application includes the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge in he required portion of the Merit Badge table and has a version date on page 2 of June 2022.

If your Scout has the wrong version of the Eagle application, go to the Scout's Advancement page then click on Eagle and change the selector at the top of the page to the correct version. Note: To use the 2016 Eagle application, all requirements except the Board of Review must be completed prior to July 1, 2022.

New One Advancement Software Suite

Recently, you may have noticed when you click on a menu item in Scoutbook, it opens a screen in Internet Advancement. We want to share with you what is happening.

We have moved all advancements to one database. This database is shared amongst platforms such as Internet Advancement, Scoutbook, the Scouting App, MyScouting, and Registrar Tools.

Over the next weeks and months, we will continue to migrate more and more functionality from Scoutbook to Internet Advancement to reduce syncing of data and improve performance. When the migration is complete, users will see changes they have entered in real time in reports and across all platforms.

We know that you like Scoutbook (We do, too!) Our focus is to maintain the functions and capabilities that Scoutbook provides in Internet Advancement such as profile update, unit advancement tracking, activity entry, calendaring, messaging, quick entry, and unit financial logging.

Eventually, we will have one app suite for advancement that is based under Internet Advancement and the Scouting App. After the full migration is complete, our next task will be to add enhancements that you have requested from the field and to continue to improve this tool for your use in serving the youth in your community. 

In addition, the SAFE Checklist pdf above is excellent tool that brings all the necessary safety components for scouting events together. The SAFE checklist (Supervision, Assessment, Fitness & Skill and Equipment & Environment) replaces the Sweet 16 of Safety.

The Transportation Safety Checklist is also included above and can be used as a safety checklist for vehicle/ trailer inspections and ensuring YPT compliance, etc.

The beginning of the year is an excellent time to provide this training to all unit leaders and parents who help transport scouts before the busy event season is upon us.
