The 2021 tax season may be over but it's never too early to plan for 2022!

What is the difference between a tax credit and a tax deduction? A tax credit is more beneficial to you on your taxes than a deduction. A tax credit reduces the amount you owe dollar-for-dollar. A tax deduction reduces the amount of income on which you are taxed and affects how much taxes you owe to the state but is not a dollar-for-dollar reduction.

Through the Arizona tax credit program which benefits organizations assisting low-income children, individuals and families, donors to the Grand Canyon Council can claim a personal tax credit for the amount of their contributions (up to \$400 for individuals and up to \$800 for couples filing jointly). Again, this reduces the amount you owe dollar for dollar! The Arizona tax credit is taken when you file your Arizona personal tax return, resulting in either less taxes owed or a larger refund. As an example, if you expect to pay \$500 on your 2022 Arizona income tax and you make a \$400 tax credit donation to GCC, next spring you will only have to pay \$100! By doing this, you are helping young people who live in challenging circumstances learn time-tested, proven skills and values that have been changing lives for over 100 years.

As always, you are encouraged to speak with a tax advisor as to what type of donation will be best for your financial circumstances.

Starting July 1 – Eagle Candidates Will Need Citizenship in Society Merit Badge

A reminder that starting July 1, 2022, those Life Scouts who do not have all requirements (except the Eagle Board of Review) signed off will need to also include the Citizenship in Society merit badge on their Eagle Application.

Eagle Scout candidates will continue to use the current rank requirements until June 30, 2022 and will not be required to complete the new Citizenship in Society Merit Badge as long as they complete all of the current Eagle Rank requirements before July 1, 2022. They do not have to submit their final Eagle Scout application nor complete their Eagle Scout Board of Review prior to July 1, 2022, but must complete all current Eagle Scout requirements before then.

So, starting July 1, 2022, Eagle Scout candidates will be required to complete all Eagle Scout requirements including the new Citizenship in Society merit badge. There will be a new Eagle Application issued in June that will have this merit badge on it. All Scouts who have not finished their Eagle requirements prior to July 1, 2022 must use this new application. Requirements for this badge are here:

Scoutmasters and other troop leaders are not authorized to sign off this new badge unless they are registered as a merit badge counselor and approved to counsel this badge. To be approved as a merit badge counselor for this badge, first make sure you are registered as a merit badge counselor. To find out how to register as a merit badge counselor, go to this page:

Scouts Can Earn BSA's Highest Honor for Conservation and Environmental Service

The BSA Distinguished Conservation Service Award encourages exemplary environmental stewardship and service. From the Boy Scouts of America's inception, Scouts have been taught the importance of conservation. In fact, Gifford Pinchot, director of the U.S. Forest Service and the BSA's first chief Scout forester, suggested conservation be added to the Scout Law. It didn't end up as part of the 12 points of the BSA's Scout Law, but the organization has since put forth many opportunities and programs to instill this value, including the BSA Distinguished Conservation Service Awards program.

Time Extensions for Life Scouts Working on Eagle Rank

Topic 9.0.4.0 of the <u>Guide to Advancement</u> details the conditions under which a Life Scout may apply for an extension of time to earn the rank of Eagle Scout.

These extensions are granted only when necessary, and only for work on the Eagle Scout rank. The Scout must meet three tests, which generally include an unforeseen circumstance or life-changing event with severe consequences that was completely beyond the control of the Scout. Completing Summer Camp Merit Badges

The rule: After summer camp, some Scouts come back with partial merit badges that need to be completed. Scouts will need to work with counselors who are properly registered and approved for that badge. Troop leaders cannot sign the Scouts off on the badge if they are not also registered as a merit badge counselor and approved to counsel the badge.

Some help: Troop leaders have access to a list of registered and approved merit badge counselors in Scoutbook on the troop page (note: the troop does not have to regularly use Scoutbook to have access to that list.) If an adult in the troop would like to be registered to counsel a certain badge, they should follow the instructions on this page.

Merit Badge Counselors for Citizenship in Society

The Merit Badge Process for Scouts, Parents, and Unit Leaders! Scouts should contact their Scoutmaster for merit badge counselor recommendations. The Scoutmaster can refer to Scoutbook for counselors or reach out directly to our Council Advancement Chairman, Bill Nelson, Bill.Nelson@scouting.org.

Updating Merit Badge Records for Scouts Attending Camp Geronimo

The Grand Canyon council is uploading the merit badge advancements for Scouts who attended Geronimo this year to Scoutbook.

The requirements and badges should show up in Scoutbook and badges in Internet Advancement the week following the camp session. They are uploaded as merit badge counselor approved. The unit still needs to approve any badges in the system before they will show up on Advancement Reports. Units should also check to make sure everything was uploaded (sometimes names are misspelled and other errors prevent an upload.) Units can still manually upload the file from Black Pug or hand enter the advancements. They methods will not interfere with each other. Send questions to: bill.nelson@scouting.org

Cub Scout Cyber Chip and Protect Yourself Rules

For Cub Scout ranks; Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos, and Arrow of Light the Cyber Chip requirement may be replaced with earning the Protect Yourself Rules Adventure. Lions do not have a Cyber Chip requirement for rank. Protect Yourself Rules Adventure. If Cub Scouts use the Protect Yourself Rules Adventure in place of the Cyber hip requirement, the adventure cannot be used as an elective for rank. For more information see:

- Be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America and age 18 or older.
- Have completed the basic position-specific training courses for their Scouting role.
- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete Parts A,
 B, and C of the Annual Health and Medical Record form.

SAFETY CORNER

Reminder: In the Four Points of SAFE Scouting, the "F" is for Fitness. Please Check-in on Adult Leaders and Youth Participants to Remind Them of the Importance of Fitness.

As you encourage leaders and participants to follow the principles of <u>SAFE</u>, you can highlight the following:

Ensure ALL participants complete an <u>Annual Health and Medical Record.</u>

- Update the health history making note of any recent changes, especially if fitness routines were paused by COVID-19.
- Stress the importance of consulting with health care professionals to consider health risks including respiratory issues, excess body weight, history of heart or cardiovascular diseases, high blood pressure, diabetes, seizures, COVID-19, etc.
- Determine fitness levels and skills testing at the unit level before strenuous Scouting activities.

Reminder: Annual Health & Medical Record

Camping season is upon us! Be sure to encourage ALL participants to fully complete the <u>Annual Health & Medical Record (AHMR)</u> for ALL activities. To be sure to have the most current information, remember to link to the AHMR, and don't host your own version. Any questions? You can find the answers on the <u>AHMR landing page</u> or the <u>AHMR FAQ page</u>.

Basics:

- Parts A & B For all events/all participants less than 72 hours in duration.
- Parts A, B & C For events/resident camps lasting 72 hours or more.
- Risk Advisory Don't forget the Risk Advisory for each
 of the High Adventure Bases. This should be reviewed
 with your healthcare provider at the time of your pre-participation exam.
- Council Based High Adventure Program We've built this template for you to develop your own risk advisory for your council high adventure program to share with your campers.
